- 3. Lecture: How to know your patient's TMJ complex status? What is the cause-and-effect correlation? How to adjust your restoration plan?
- 4. Hands-on: Make a note of the cause-and-effect correlation to your case.
- 5. Lecture: Common Temporomandibular Joint Disorders (TMDs) and their diagnostic criteria

Afternoon section (3 hours):

- 1. Lecture: Local and systemic etiologies of common TMDs.
- 2. Hands-on: Make a note of the etiology and diagnosis for your case.
- 3. Lecture: Management guidelines of TMDs and the appropriate usage of oral appliances.
- 4. Hands-on: Analyze four real clinical cases to setup diagnoses and treatment plans.
- 5. Summary and take-home message.
